School Annual Education Report (AER)

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for White Cloud Junior High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

White Cloud Junior High School continues to strive to improve our educational processes and minimizing our educational gaps based on M-Step/SAT/P-SAT/NWEA MAPS testing data. We continue to focus on Mathematics, Reading, and Writing through our building initiatives such as homework support, positive behavioral supports, special education programming, At-risk supports, Title 1, multi-tiered system of support, and virtual school programs.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

- 1. The process of assigning pupils to the school includes parent(s) or guardian(s) completing an enrollment packet, which the parent(s) or guardian(s) must provide specific information pertaining to residency, former school, valid student information, etc.
- 2. The status of our 3–5-year school improvement plan is an ongoing process, which we continue to work on and update on an annual basis. School and District Improvement Plans must fit with the Strategic Planning of White Cloud Public Schools.
- 3. White Cloud Junior High School is comprised of grades 6-8.

- 4. White Cloud Junior High School used the national (Common Core), state and local benchmarks and objectives for our core curriculum. The MDE has established the Michigan Merit Curriculum (MMC) which can be found on the MDE website or with contact with our 6-8 guidance counselor. If you would like to view your student's progress towards completion of the Michigan Merit Curriculum, please make an appointment or request a copy of your student's transcripts.
- 5. Data from local assessments, M-Step, P-SAT, SAT, and NWEA MAPS are reviewed and analyzed based on all students and all subgroups of students.
