On Tuesday, May 6, 2025, voters living in the White Cloud Public Schools district will have the opportunity to consider a bond proposal that, if approved, would result in \$28.4 million for district-wide facility improvements with a **ZERO TAX-RATE INCREASE** over the 2024 levy expected.

This bond would allow for safety and security upgrades, while also addressing aging facilities to provide modernized learning and athletic environments. The proposal comes as a result of in-depth evaluations by school staff, parents and community members to create a long-term plan that addresses the current and future needs of district facilities and programs.

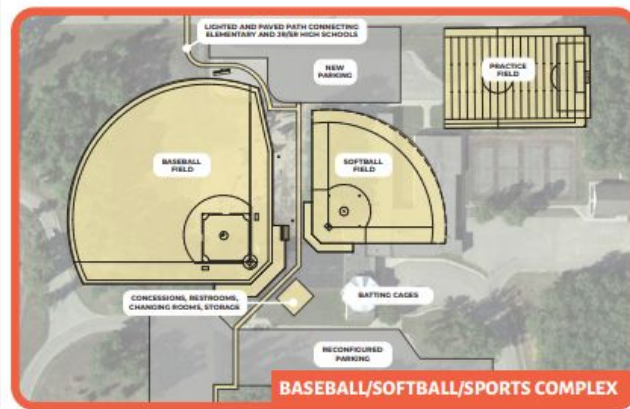

The JV baseball team split their recent doubleheader. They started strong with an 11-0 victory in the first game. The second game resulted in a 6-11 loss. Offensively, Joey Coon led the team with 4 hits, including a double and a triple. Riley Borgman had a productive day at the plate with two doubles and a triple, and Kamren Storms added 3 hits. Storms also led the team with 3 RBIs. The team showcased aggressive baserunning, totaling 27 stolen bases, with Joey Coon leading the charge with 6. On the mound, Keith Shick delivered an excellent performance in game one, allowing only 1 hit, issuing no walks, and striking out 8. In game two, Austin Webster came in as relief and pitched scoreless innings without allowing a hit, giving the team an opportunity to try and come back, but they ultimately came up short.

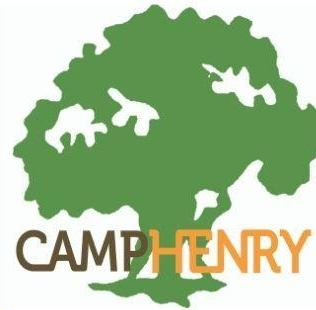
