Tanayah Klammer's Big Day Propels White Cloud Indians Past Hart Pirates in their opening home game:

Tanayah Klammer collected four hits in four at bats, as White Cloud Varsity Indians defeated Hart Pirates 10-6 yesterday. Klammer doubled in the 5th inning, singled in the first, second, and fourth inning. White Cloud Indians got on the board in the button of the first inning after Jorja Baker singled, Emily Hedlund tripled, and Brooke Ringler singled, each scoring one run. A sacrifice bunt by Keira Baker extended the Indians lead to 4-0 in the bottom of the second. A steal at home by Baker extended the Indians lead to 5-3 in the bottom of the third. Hedlund earned the win for the Indians, The left-handed pitcher gave up six hits and six runs (five earned) over five and two-thirds innings, striking out eight and walking three. 
