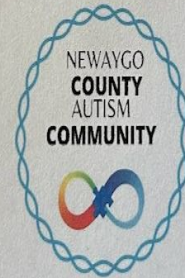

What is SLE?

- SLE is a one-week program for current Juniors (High School Class of 2025) to visit West Point in June.
