# **Athletics**

The JV baseball team split a double header with Central Montcalm yesterday. In game 1,the Indians offense scored 21 runs, led by Zander Trapp, Blake Borgman, Ben Fehrlen and Trystan Tancock. Jaxon Ruether picked up the win on the mound. The team lost game 2, but were led by Logan Stamp and Jaxon Ruether with 2 hits each.

The White Cloud Varsity Baseball team opened up league play hosting Central Montcalm in a twin bill Tuesday night. The blustering winds played havoc for both teams as Central Montcalm was able to weather the storm coming out victorious in game one winning 13-2. Jayson Ruether took the loss despite pitching very well, recording six strikeouts. Walks and errors proved to be the demise of White Cloud. Kevin Strait, Landyn McGowen, and Brycen Knight each collected one hit for the Indians.

White Cloud Varsity was triumphant over Central Montcalm 6-2 in game two. A single by Mason Cruzan on an 0-2 count put the Indians on the board in the bottom of the first. Landyn McGowen drove the middle of the lineup, leading White Cloud going 2-2 with 2 RBI's. Brycen Knight added two hits and 1 RBI. McGowen earned the win pitching 5 innings giving up 2 runs and striking out four.

White Cloud improves their record to 4-2. The Indians travel to Big Rapids on Friday.

"The boys' track and field team defeated all three of their opponents in CSAA action last night in Central Montcalm. Final scores were: White Cloud 80 - Central Montcalm 56, White Cloud 85- Morley Stanwood 52 and White Cloud 100 - Grant 36. A great team effort led by Seniors Carson Foondle, Noah Robinson, and Lloyd Sebright- Johnson, with special congrats to Sophomore Giuliano Venditti for his wonderful performances in the 110 and 300 hurdles, where he finished 2nd and 1st, respectively, with personal best in both. The boys are now 4-1 in the CSAA The Indians will be in Hesperia Friday night to take part in the 12 team Small School Invitational."

The girls traveled to Central Montcalm to compete against CM, Morley, and Grant. The SWEET 16 competed with grit to take down Morley and Grant. Nine athletes PR'd and 3 of the relay teams PR's as well! Justice PR'd in the 100 (13.27) and the 400 (1.09). Gabriella Dakin PR'd the 200 (30.13) and her 4x200 team PR'd (2:05) with Caedy Traynor, Haillee Brown and Ryleigh Balke. Izzy Shockley PR'd in the 400 (1:160), took 1st place overall in the pole vault and her 4x400 (5:24) with Molly Francis, Caedy Traynor and Payton Bird, and 4x800 (13:05) with Molly Francis, Payten Bird and Brooklyn Foondle. teams both PRd. Payten Bird PR'd the 800 (3:14) and the Discus (80'4.5) Molly Francis PR'd the 800 (3:20) and High Jump (4'4) Charlotte Karnes PR'd the 800 (3:51) Jayla Perrin PR'd in all her events: Shotput (23'9), Discus (65'8.9), High Jump (4'2) and Kacie Kailing PR'd in the shotput (20'4).
